He is the founder of SkyPilot Theatre Company's Playwrights Wing and currently a visiting professor of playwriting for Hollins University's innovative Playwrights Lab. STEPHEN GREGG (Playwright - The New Margo) Stephen Gregg's play This Is a Test helped define a genre of one acts when it appeared in 1988, and it continues to be one of the most produced one-act plays in the country. Since then, he has published more than 20 plays for secondary schools to perform, including Small Actors, One Lane Bridge, The New Margo, S.P.A.R., Twitch and Wake-Up Call. His full-length play Crush appeared on the mainstage of the International Thespian Festival in 2016, and Trap appeared on the main stage of the festival in 2018. He has received a Jerome Fellowship from the Playwrights' Center of Minneapolis, the Actors Theatre of Louisville's Heideman Award for best 10-minute play (A Private Moment) and the International Thespian Society's Founders Award for service to youth and theatre. Crush was developed during a residency at the William Inge Center for the Arts. He is a member of the Writers Guild America West and Lab Twenty6 writers group. Gregg teaches himself to write plays, one tweet at a time. He lives with his husband, Todd, in Venice Beach, Calif.

MICHAEL WOODY (Playwright - What's Left) was born on August 3rd, 2006, in Southern California. He moved to Mt. Pleasant South Carolina in June of 2017. He has been acting for seven years and will continue to do so. He has been in shows such as Wando High School Theater's Murder Medium Rare, Eurydice, Puffs, and Mean Girls. He has even written and directed a thirty-minute show once, a Western parody named Bobby Bigface. He is the playwright of What's Left, an award-winning one-act being performed today. He works well with most people and always tries to treat

everyone with utmost respect.

DAKOTA DEMATO (Showcase Director) is the Director of Theatre here at South Pointe! She holds a B F A in Musical Theatre from The University of the Arts (Philadelphia, PA) and an M.A.T. in Theatre Education from the University of South Carolina. Since joining the staff at South Pointe in 2020, she has directed fourteen productions with the Stallion Repertory Theatre. In addition, she has choreographed Mamma Mia!, Chicago, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, Curtains, and Boundless at South Pointe. Her direction of the one acts The Miraculous Iourney of Edward Tulane and In the Garden of the Selfish Giant have both placed in the Top Eight at the South Carolina Theatre Association Annual Convention. The latter also received a Superior Rating at the Palmetto Dramatic Association Festival. This past February, her direction of the one-act When She Had Wings was selected as the alternate show to represent the state of South Carolina at the national festival, also earning a Superior. In her time at South Pointe, she started the school's first-ever dance program. Before her time at South Pointe, Ms. Demato was fortunate enough to build the Elementary Dance and Theatre programs for Lexington-Richland School District 5 at Nursery Road Elementary School-Arts Magnet in Columbia, SC. Before becoming a full-time educator, Ms. Demato had the great privilege of performing with dozens of professional theatre companies; including Irondale, Headlong Dance Theatre, and Pig Iron Theatre Company. She has even performed twice at the esteemed Philadelphia Fringe Festival, Ms. Demato has directed and choreographed over 30 full-scale musicals and plays for students of all ages. She is a multiaward-winning choreographer for her work in South Florida, While in Philadelphia, Ms. Demato taught for Theatre Horizon's awardwinning Autism Drama program. Additionally, Ms. Demato is an alumnus of the International Thespian Society and is thrilled to now be a Troupe Director for Troupe 7010. She is also the Treasurer for the South Carolina Thespians. Ms. Demato is a proud alumnus of the South Florida

Cappies program, in which she is now the Program Director for the Carolina Cappies (reach out to her to find out more!) Every summer Ms. Demato is honored to be the Conference Coordinator for the National Conference for the American Alliance for Theatre & Education (AATE), which she has also been a proud member of since 2017. In the summer of 2025, she is thrilled to be one of the Co-Chairs for the AATE National Conference, which will be hosted in Charlotte! 
